participation Environmental factors This section assesses the clients physical and social environment identifying any barriers or supports 4 Occupational Performance Evaluation Observation and assessment This section describes the therapists direct observations of the clients performance in various tasks using standardized assessments or clinical observations Domains assessed This can include areas such as motor skills sensory processing cognition communication psychosocial functioning and activity tolerance Specific observations This section provides detailed information on specific skills and behaviors observed including strengths weaknesses and limitations 5 Problem List Based on the gathered information this section summarizes the clients identified problems including limitations and areas needing intervention 6 Goals and Interventions Shortterm goals These are specific measurable achievable relevant and timebound SMART goals that focus on immediate improvements Longterm goals These outline the clients desired functional outcomes for the future Intervention plan This section outlines the proposed interventions including specific strategies frequency duration and expected outcomes 7 Recommendations This section outlines any further assessments referrals or recommendations for the clients care plan 3 Discharge planning This section addresses the clients future needs including followup appointments community resources and assistive technology Benefits of Using Comprehensive Evaluation Forms Enhanced accuracy and consistency Standardized forms ensure that all relevant information is gathered and recorded consistently minimizing subjectivity and potential biases Improved treatment planning The comprehensive data provides a strong foundation for
