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excerpt from the valuation of convertible bonds convertible bonds are bonds that are convertible into another security at the option of the holder subject to conditions specified in the indenture for our paper we will restrict the term convertible to mean exchangeable for the common stock of the issuing corporation the restriction is not a stringent one the author in examining publicly traded bonds issued between 1948 and 1963 by companies that are traded on an organized stock exchange or over the counter found no bonds which were excluded by that definition the vast majority of nation wide traded convertible bonds
